This arrangement of the English Folk Song *All Around My Hat* uses the version popularized by Steeleye Span in 1975. This version combines the chorus of *All Around My Hat* with the verses from another English Folk Song, *Farewell He!*

The percussion part is optional, and should be played on a deep and dry drum such as a Tenor drum (no snares), Djembe, or a large Frame drum played with a mallet
